Landscape Maintenance

Covenant Inspections are taking place regularly and the volume of Violations has become abnormally high. The landscape in many of the yards has become neglected and needs some extra care. These were the most common Violations identified during the most recent inspection:

- Lawns should be green and free and bare spots or weeds.
- Shrubs should be trimmed clear of walkways.
- Rock beds and mulch beds should be free of weeds.
- Plant material should be living and cleared of dead leaves.
- Plant pots should have thriving plants in them.

If these issues exist in your yard, please make some time to address them right away. Each violation may result in a fine, so multiple violations may result in multiple fines. Reference Article IV of the Covenants for clarification on these standards.

Getting Your Lawn Ready for Summer

Most of our Pikes Peak region lawns are cool season grasses. That means that most active growth occurs when temperatures are 60 to 75°F. Kentucky bluegrass, fescues and rye are cool season grasses. These grasses benefit from some early spring care, here are a few pointers toward a great lawn this year.

Irrigate only when the turf indicates water is needed. Look for signs of wilt, which often show up in the same location on the lawn time after time. Footprints or lawn mower tracks that remain at least one-half hour after traffic has passed indicates irrigation is needed. Bear in mind that Colorado Springs has restrictions on water use for landscapes. Residents are not permitted to water more than three times per week, or to water between 10 am and 6 pm from May to October. See details at: Water Wise Rules (csu.org) Water Wise Rules (csu.org)

Roots need access to oxygen in the soil, since we cannot cultivate soil under turf, compaction is a problem in lawns. The solution is core aeration; which is a process whereby 2-3" deep plugs are pulled out of the turf, usually by a powered core aerator. Water your lawn one or two days prior to aeration. Leave the plugs on your lawn to decompose. Aerate as soon as the soil is not frozen or snow covered.

Spring is a good time for a first application of fertilizer, if you did not apply in late fall. Apply 1 pound of Nitrogen (N) per 1000 sq. ft. Using a spreader will ensure that your application is even and doesn't damage the lawn. Many fertilizers labeled for spring application, also contain preemergent weed controls. It is important to make a conscious decision about whether to use these products.
